

Holding a Diversity Day

The best way to create change in your school is by first bringing to light that there are issues. One way to do this is to hold a Diversity Day!

Talk with other clubs and groups that meet at school, focusing on groups that are interested in multicultural and civil rights issues. Together, organize an event where you can engage with other students in school, and talk about diversity and the importance of making sure everyone has a place and feels like they belong. You could:

- Put together a brochure talking about the GSA, or LGBTQ issues
- Bake treats, and attach affirming messages to the wrapper
- Create a petition for a safer and more inclusive campus, and collect signatures
- The possibilities are endless!

This activity is great, because along with talking about diversity and inclusion at school, the GSA is also building a coalition of allied groups that believe that everyone should be included and respected.

Make sure to check in with your administration about what rules and procedures the GSA needs to follow to hold a Diversity Day event, and ask for the participation of faculty!
